VFW Post 6722 Auxiliary Conducts Young American Patriot Art Contest

The Ernest Simmons VFW Post 6722 Auxiliary conducted the American Patriot Art Contest in March/April of this year. This contest gives local schoolchildren an opportunity to show off their artistic talents and a chance to win scholarship money for higher education. The contest involves several phases where schoolchildren have their artwork judged at the local, state, and national level. Post 6722 Auxiliary began the local selection process on 1 April 2025.

The Post and Auxiliary worked together as a team and formed a joint committee to judge the received artwork. Artists had to submit their work by 31 March 2025 to the committee. The young artists from Harnett County schools submitted their artwork to the committee and the selection committee was quite impressed with the artistic talent displayed by the schoolchildren.

Jodi Hardy, the president of the VFW 6722 Auxiliary commented, "We have some really artistic and talented students in our area. In the hearts of these students, these pieces of artwork are priceless to them. They were proud to submit their work to be judged by the committee."

This patriotic themed art contest challenged the students' artistic abilities. The local contest consisted of three school grade divisions: K-2, 3-5 and 6-8. There are State and National awards for first, second, and third place in each grade division. The VFW 6722 Auxiliary received entries for school grade categories 3-5 and 6-8. On April 1, the committee judged the artwork in each grade category. The Auxiliary mailed the first place artwork to VFW State for judging on April 2.

The first place entry received a \$30 gift card


from VFW 6722 Auxiliary and a chance to compete at the state level.

Charlotte Smirnov of Harnett Central Middle School took second place with her rendition of an American flag over a sunset.




Star Academy took third place with this rendition of cartoon school kids.

Cioppino

The Real San Francisco Treat!

Ingredients

3/4 cup butter

2 onions, chopped

1 bunch fresh parsley, chopped

2 cloves garlic, minced

2 (14.5 ounce) cans stewed tomatoes

2 (14.5 ounce) cans chicken broth

1 ½ cups white wine

1 cup water

2 bay leaves

1 tablespoon dried basil

½ teaspoon dried thyme

½ teaspoon dried oregano

1 ½ pounds cod fillets, cubed

1 ½ pounds large shrimp - peeled and deveined

1 ½ pounds bay scallops

18 small clams

18 mussels, cleaned and debearded

1 ½ cups crabmeat

Directions

- 1. Melt butter in a large stockpot over medium-low heat. Add onions, parsley, and garlic. Cook and stir until onions are softened, 3 to 4 minutes.
- 2. Add tomatoes to the pot (break them into chunks as you add them). Stir in chicken broth, wine, water, bay leaves, basil, thyme, and oregano. Cover and simmer for 30 minutes.
- 3. Stir in cod, shrimp, scallops, clams, mussels, and crabmeat. Bring to boil; lower heat, cover, and simmer until clams open up, 5 to 7 minutes. Ladle soup into bowls and serve.
- 4. Enjoy!
